Mask Requirement Remains in Place at the College

Five policy/procedure items are posted on the College's P&P webpage for College community review and feedback. Comments and suggestions are due by Friday, February 11. The five items are:

66005 & 66005CP - Data Asset Management and Security: This proposed new policy and procedure would govern the confidentiality, integrity, availability, ethical use of and quality of College data to drive evidence-based decision making.

66002 & 66002 CP - Confidential Data Management and Security: These modifications update the policy language to align with the new Policy 66005. Procedure changes include updates of the definitions.
41003 CP - Student Cumulative Records: This modification updates the definition of "Personally Identifiable Information" to align with the new policy 66005.

41006 & 41006CP - Board of Trustees Scholar Award: This modification would change the name of the award to Board of Trustees Academic Excellence Award, align the awards with the College's academic units, and create a standard process for student applications and selection.

41007 & 41007CP - Board of Trustees Apprenticeship Scholar Award: This modification would change the name of the award to Board of Trustees Apprenticeship Academic Excellence Award and align the application and selection process with 41006CP.

Since the pandemic, the instances of mental health crises have been on the rise. This training teaches participants how to identify when someone might be dealing with a mental health problem and how to intervene in a mental health crisis situation.

The course begins with approximately 2 hours of content that participants must view prior to the training. Then a live 6-hour Zoom training will take place on the date you register for. Upon successful completion of the course, all participants will receive a 3-year Mental Health First Aid certification.
