FY22 Budget Update

Liz Greaney, Chief Business/Financial Strategy Officer

- Budget Development Considerations
 - Budget must be balanced – can't spend more than revenue resources
 - Alignment to MC 2025 Strategic Plan
 - Montgomery County has a legal obligation to meet maintenance of effort or same level of funding as FY21
 - State aid allocated based on the Cade formula – partially based on state commitment to 4-year colleges and partially based on MC's full-time equivalency enrollment
 - Need agility as we monitor our revenue sources; county, state and tuition and fees
 - Enrollment trends and workforce demands
 - A volatile economic environment, pandemic induced
- Shared data on student enrollment trends
- Shared timeline for budget approvals
 - Operating budget – salary, supply purchases, professional development, etc.
 - Capital budget – buildings, large equipment systems, and so on
 - April 2021 – BOT approves FY22 tuition and fees
 - April/May 2021 – County Council sessions on MC budget
 - May 2021 – County Council approves county budget
 - 6/21/21 – BOT approves final FY22 budget
- Governor recommended to move away from Cade formula and tie budget closely to revenue.
 - Advocating to restore Cade funding
- Question – Can you talk more about Cade formula? What's the difference with revenue?
 - Revenue – resources that we have to expend dollars
 - Cade formula – attempt to bring some equity to financing community colleges
 - Complicated formula that was intended to mature over time.
- Question – Where does the information on the enrollment decrease in WDCE come from?
 - State aid for certain programs – information from trends and enrollment patterns
 - Grant funding – analyze start and end of grants
- Question – Can you provide update on progress of the funding for TPSS construction?
 - Capital budget – issue related to equipment purchases
 - Advocating for full funding at both state and county level
 - Will have a meeting soon
 - Question – Is there something that Governance can do to help?

 - County committed to maintenance of effort
 - FY22 Budget fully plans to utilize savings
- Question – Can you help us understand what the money we’re getting from the government due to COVID-19 is used for? How does it connect or not connect to our operating budget?
 - College has access to federal stimulus dollars to help offset costs incurred due to the pandemic or need to incur to recover from the pandemic.
 - Specific amount dedicated to student emergency aid
 - Institutional funds – used for trainings, technology for employees and students, etc.
 - One-time money – not intended to be recurring
